JESUS COMMANDED IT

At the Last Supper, Jesus took bread and wine and said, *"Do this in remembrance of me."*

IT PROCLAIMS THE STORY OF SALVATION

Every Eucharist retells God's story:

- Christ has died.
- Christ is risen.
- Christ will come again.

CHRIST IS TRULY PRESENT

Anglicans believe that Christ is truly present in the Eucharist, though we do not try to define exactly how this mystery occurs. *The presence is real, but the manner is a mystery.*

IT UNITES US AS THE BODY OF CHRIST

The Eucharist is never a private act. We gather as one family around one table. Receiving one bread and one cup reminds us that we belong to one another.

SUMMARY OF READINGS - SECOND SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Today's readings remind us that God is faithful even when life is painful, His mercy meets us in our distress, and new life in Christ calls for costly trust and courage.

In Genesis 21:8-21 - Hagar and Ishmael are sent into the wilderness after tension with Sarah. When hope runs out, God hears the boy's cry, provides water, and promises to make him a great nation.

In Psalm 86:1-10, 16-17 - a desperate prayer for mercy rises to God, trusting His goodness, forgiveness, and steadfast love. The psalmist asks for strength and a sign of God's favour.

In Romans 6:1b-11 - Paul declares that in baptism we die with Christ and rise to new life. Sin no longer has mastery because we now live in Christ.

In Matthew 10:24-39 - Jesus prepares His disciples for rejection and division. Following Him may bring opposition, but true life is found in wholehearted allegiance to Christ.

Together these Readings remind us that God provides in the wilderness, hears our cry, gives new life in Christ, and calls us to follow Him with undivided faith—even when it costs us everything.

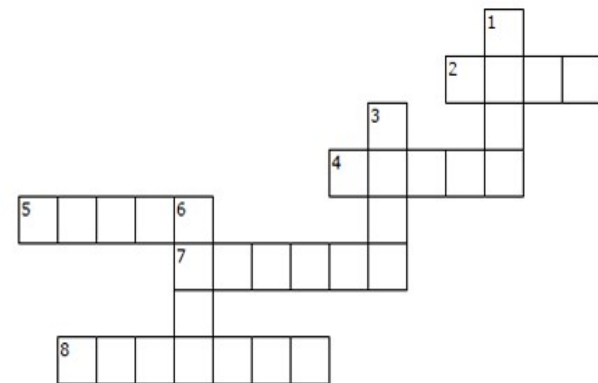
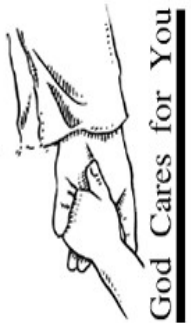
