SUMMARY OF READINGS - TRINITY SUNDAY

The readings draw us into the mystery of God's life, and into the calling to live as people shaped, sent and held together by divine communion.

In Genesis 1:1-2:4a, God creates all things by word and Spirit, bringing order, life, and goodness out of chaos.

In Psalm 8, God's majesty fills the heavens, yet humanity is crowned with dignity and entrusted with care for creation.

In 2 Corinthians 13:11-13, Paul blesses the church with grace from Jesus Christ, love from God, and fellowship of the Holy Spirit.

In Mathew 28:16-20, The risen Jesus sends his disciples to make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, promising his presence always.

Together, The Trinity is revealed not as abstraction, but as lived reality: The Father creates. The Son redeems. The Spirit sustains and sends

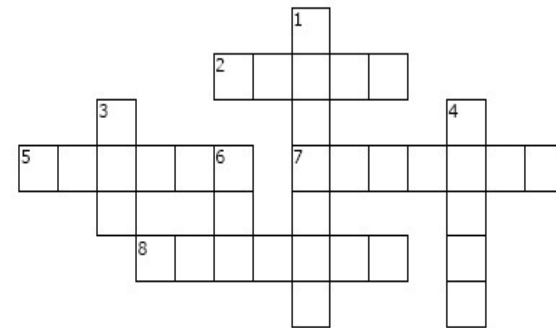
